A/Prof Jacqui Horan

Associate Professor of Law | Monash University

A/Prof Jacqui Horan is a courtroom researcher and Associate Professor, as well as a member of the Victorian Bar (academic). She leads two Australian Research Council Linkage projects focused on interviewing 111 Australian jurors to understand their perceptions of expert evidence.

Since the opening of Monash Law Faculty's moot courtroom, A/Prof Horan has served as the academic lead for this research platform, overseeing the faculty's mooting program. Before joining Monash in 2018, she coordinated the 'Trial Practice and Advocacy' course at Melbourne University Law School for 15 years, teaching advocacy to legal practitioners through various continuing education programs.

Prior to her academic career, A/Prof Horan worked as an Associate for the Honourable Mr Justice Sir James Gobbo AC at the Supreme Court of Victoria and at Mallesons Stephen Jaques. As a barrister, she specialised in professional negligence and misconduct, serving as an accredited mediator and VCAT-appointed conciliator. She was primarily briefed by disciplinary bodies such as the Legal Profession Tribunal, Victorian Lawyers RPA, the Dental Board of Victoria and the Medical Practitioners Board of Victoria.



Judge Christopher O'Neill

Former Victorian County Court Judge

Judge Christopher O'Neill was admitted to practice law in 1979. After spending 12 years as a solicitor in general practice, he joined the Victorian Bar in 1991, focusing on common law, including personal injury, medical negligence, professional disciplinary tribunals, and coronial inquests.

In 2007, he was appointed as a Judge of the County Court, serving in both common law and criminal jurisdictions. He held the position of Judge in Charge of the Common Law Division from 2015 to 2018. Notably, from 2019 to 2021, he was the Judge in Charge of the Appeals and Post Sentence Applications (APSA) List, overseeing the Court's work on post-sentence orders. Judge O'Neill retired from the County Court at the end of 2021.

Beyond his judicial responsibilities, Judge O'Neill has been deeply committed to legal education. He has lectured at the Victorian Bar Readers' Course, taught judgment writing at the County Court and the Judicial College of Victoria, and provided advocacy training in Papua New Guinea and the Solomon Islands, demonstrating his dedication to sharing knowledge and supporting others in the legal field.

Dr David Blumenthal Barrister | Victorian Bar

Dr David Blumenthal is a Victorian barrister primarily practising in public law, with a special interest in the intersection of law and public policy.

Before joining the Bar, Dr Blumenthal was Chief of Staff to Mark Dreyfus KC MP, overseeing the federal Attorney-General's portfolio in both Opposition and Government. He also served as a Senior Adviser in Climate Change and Environment, focusing on assessments under the EPBC Act.

Prior to work with the federal government, Dr Blumenthal taught criminal and international law at the University of Melbourne, and worked as an independent legal consultant on parliamentary inquiries, the Royal Commission into the Metropolitan Ambulance Service and the ACT Coroner's Inquiry into the 2003 Bushfires. Dr Blumenthal has also worked at the Victorian Department of Justice, and commenced his legal career at Mallesons in dispute resolution and litigation.

Dr Blumenthal holds honours degrees in Arts and Law, and a PhD in Political Science from the University of Melbourne.
